Connecticut DECA is committed to advocacy of marketing education and the growth of both business and educational partnerships. Through competitive events at the state and national level, as well as state and regional conferences, members in Connecticut DECA build bridges between school and work while linking student occupational goals with leadership, professional, and community service opportunities. Each year, CT DECA invites business professionals to serve as judges in our program of competitive events. These events include category specific role-play case studies for individuals and teams of two as well as research project manuals with presentations on different business topics.

YOUR DAY AS A JUDGE: CT DECA will send you a confirmation email prior to the conference with important information about being a judge at this year's conference. All judging takes place on the day of the conference. Judges interact with the students in interviews, role-plays, or presentations.

YOUR TYPICAL SCHEDULE AS A JUDGE: Please plan to arrive early so that you may have time to enjoy coffee and pastries before your event. Judges should plan on arriving no later than 7:15am to be ready for students. Event ending times may vary based on participants, but all judging should be completed before 1:30pm.

MORE INFORMATION ABOUT EVENTS:

PRINCIPLES OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION EVENTS: These events are designated to first year DECA members. The concept is that the students are given an interview situation where they need to demonstrate professionalism and knowledge in a specific business related area.

Events: Principles of Business Administration and Management, Principles of Marketing, Principles of Hospitality, and Principles of Finance

SERIES EVENTS: Judges take part in a role-playing situation with the high school student to evaluate how well the student demonstrates different business competencies. In these role-playing events, students are required to accomplish a task or solve a problem by translating what they have learned in the classroom into effective, efficient, and spontaneous action.

Events: Accounting Applications, Apparel and Accessories Marketing, Automotive Services Marketing, Business Finance, Business Services Marketing, Food Marketing, Hotel and Lodging Management, Human Resources Management, Marketing Management, Quick Serve Restaurant Management, Restaurant and Food Service Management, Retail Merchandising, and Sports and Entertainment Marketing

TEAM DECISION MAKING EVENTS: The Management Team Decision Making events are designed for a team of two participants, who work together to solve a problem or develop a plan to present to senior management (the judge). The judge evaluates the students' presentation and their response to questions.

Events: Business Law and Ethics, Buying and Merchandising, Financial Services, Hospitality Services, Marketing Communications, Sports and Entertainment Marketing, and Travel and Tourism

WRITTEN EVENTS: DECA has four main types of written events: promotion plans, business operations research events, entrepreneurship business plans, and chapter projects. A judge working with a research or entrepreneurship project may either evaluate the written portion or the presentation portion regarding a marketing research and/or business plan that the student team has developed. Judges working with chapter projects will evaluate a chapter's program of activities that was used to accomplish a specific goal, and the students' presentation of that project. The written portion of these events are scored ahead of time with the presentations being judged on the day of the conference.
